Well, no match reports this month but we are training hard as usual and fortunately the weather has so far been kind to us all, lets hope it remains that way.

Training is going really well and we can really see improvement from week to week. We have up until now concentrated on the basics, nothing fancy, basic positions and skills development , but we are now ready to move on. We will though be ready for this game and we will spend the next few weeks refining our tactics. Beyond that we look to arrange as many games as we can as we go into the Spring and Summer, we will also enter as many of the local tournaments as we can. So we will be in for a busy time ahead.

Finally, Nick and I would like to thank all the players for their commitment and enthusiasm during training. We have really tried to keep the training fun and enjoyable for all and so far we have only had to use the famous sin bin twice. This is a huge improvement on last season , well done to you all.

Our last training of the year will be on December 22nd. Please note that this will be a kick around and not a normal session, Nick Skerratt will be in charge and he will start at 10.30am as usual.

Finally , don't forget the Christmas Tournament on December 15th, I need your £6.00, asap.

I would be very grateful if parents would help me with this and continue to explain these concepts and meanings to the lads whenever they get the opportunity.
