EDITORIAL



When I go down to Barr Lane on a Sunday morning to watch my lad play for the under 11's I am often impressed by the turn out, often in quite bad weather. The lowest crowd for a proper league match was the great game between Leicester City and Stockport County on the 7th May 1921. It pulled a crowd of just 13! This glorious indifference was accentuated by the fact that both teams were playing away from home. Stockport's ground had been temporarily closed and the match was held at Manchester United's immense stadium.

What about dodgy goalkeepers? We've all seen a few havn't we? Senhor Isadore Irandir of the Brazilian team Rio Petro let in a goal after just 3 seconds. From the kick off in the match between Corinthians and Rio Petro at Bahia Stadium, the ball was passed to Roberto Revelino who scored instantly with a left foot drive from the halfway line. The MAN in BLACK With Referee Darren Clarke

The last issue of "The Brink" had the question, **when can a player NOT be in an offside position?** There is no offside offence if a player receives the ball directly from:

- A goal kick
- A throw –in
- A corner kick

Well, I am sure every person involved in football got that right!

LAW 3 – The Number of Players.

A match may not start if either team consists of fewer than seven players.

In all matches, the names of the substitutes must be given to the referee before the start of the match. Substitutes not named may not take part in the match.

Substitution Procedures.

To replace a player by substitution, the following conditions must be observed:

- The referee is informed before any substitution is made.
- A substitute only enters the field after the player being replaced has left and after receiving a signal from the referee.
- A substitute can only enter the field from the halfway line and during a stoppage in the match.

If a substitute enters the field without the referee's permission:

- The substitute is cautioned and required to leave the field of play.
- Play is then restarted, with a drop ball at the place it was located when play was stopped.

If a player changes places with the goalkeeper without the referee's permission:

- Play continues.
- The players concerned are cautioned, when the ball is next out of play.

LAW 4 – The Players Equipment.

A player must not use equipment, or wear anything which is dangerous to himself or another player (including any kind of jewellery).

Shinguards:

- Are covered entirely by the socks.
- Are made of a suitable material.
- Provide a reasonable degree of protection.

For any infringement of this Law:

- Play need not be stopped.
- The player at fault is instructed by the referee to leave the field and correct his/her equipment.
- The player leaves the field when the ball next ceases to be in play, unless he/she has already corrected their equipment.
- Any player who requires to leave the field does not re-enter without the referee's permission.
- The player is only allowed to re-enter the field when the ball is out of play.

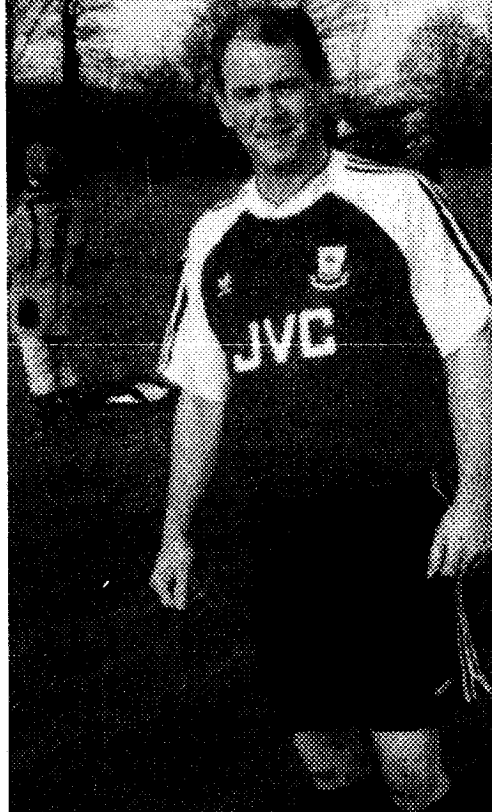
