Margaret will also be looking for anything else that the press might find of interest, if your team is organising a fund raising event or just doing something exciting please let Margaret know.

I have now introduced a 'Managers Resource' area onto the clubs website, this contains all the official documentation necessary to run the club plus a discussion forum for the managers. It has been necessary to protect access to this info due to the official nature of the items on the site.

The club has also been looking around for a new venue to host the presentation night for this year. The club has grown rapidly in terms of numbers but we felt it was important that we still try & get everyone together as one group. To this end we have secured the use of Broad Street Rugby Club in Binley for the evening of Friday 17th June. The facility hold 250-300 people & also has a very large secure area for all the lads to go & play, food is also being organised by Broad Street. More details are to follow.

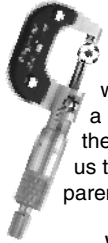

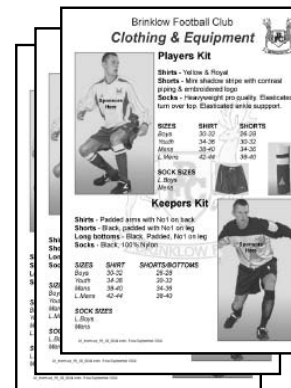
Presentation Evening!!

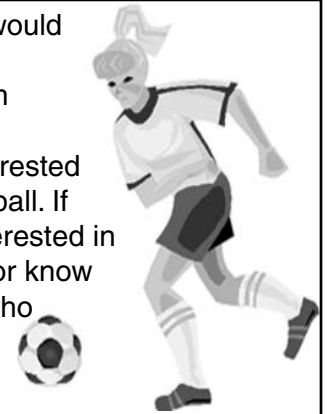

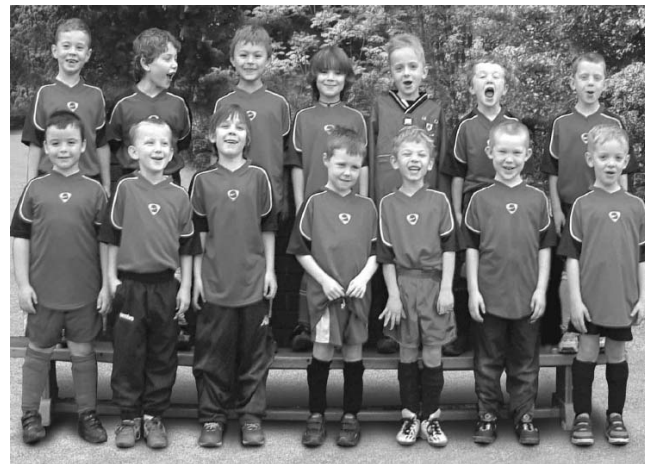
