I spent a few years coaching our girls section until I began my Honours Degree in Sport & Exercise Science at University. Now that my 3 years in Lincoln have ended, it is time to give something back to Brinklow, ensuring that every player gets the best opportunities available.

My philosophy is primarily to offer a variety of enjoyable, yet organised & professional services to both coaches and players. Applying the relevant multi-disciplinary scientific principles "to the field" in a way which players actually understand is key (principles which The FA are beginning to employ at both grass roots and internationally). Being able to design and apply Progressive Training Plans, Schemes of Work & Athlete Development is important, by using various methods of; technical coaching, strength & conditioning, nutrition, remedial management & recovery for injuries, video & statistical analysis, and working with individuals; all by simplifying my experience of anatomy, physiology, biomechanics, motion analysis and psychology amongst many other things.
